Field Trip to Heifer Project International for Grades 2 – 5 on November 7th

Their Wednesday night study has focused on hunger, sharing, and the Heifer Project International. Heifer International, a non-profit organization, works to end world hunger and save the earth through the gift of farm animals and training. Instead of providing families in need with a non-renewable source of food, Heifer International provides a “living loan” of an animal and extensive training in animal care, community development and earth-friendly practices. Children in grades 2 – 5, even those not attending the Wednesday Family night, can go to the Heifer Ranch on Tuesday, November 7th. We will leave at 8 a.m. and return around 8 p.m. Our field trip will include the Heifer Intro and Video, hay wagon tour, village trail, and hands on activities such as brick-making and rope making. Session Minutes

Called Meeting - July 27, 2006

The called meeting of the session was held at the church at 6:40 p.m. with the following elders, constituting a quorum, present: Jamie Tipton, Ray Hill, Ham Brankstone, Chris Brown, Jason Parolli, Frank Jue, and Ralph Kennedy. Elder-elect Michelle Eaves was also present. The primary purpose of the called meeting was to consider communications (letters) recently received from First Presbyterian Church, Corinth, MS, and First Presbyterian Church, Greenwood, MS, concerning the report of the Theological Task Force on the Peace, Unity, and Purity of the church adopted by the GA217.

Rev. Robert A. Hatcher, Jr. opened the meeting with prayer.

After discussion, it was moved, seconded, and unanimously approved to endorse a draft copy of an overture presented to the session by Rev. Hatcher addressed to St. Andrew Presbytery asking that it approve statements and explanatory comments concerning the above referenced report of the Theological Task Force on the Peace, Unity, and Purity. In addition, the session approved by common consent for copies of the overture to be made available to the congregation at the church office and on FPC bulletin boards.

Rev. Hatcher recently received a request from St. Andrew Global Mission Committee to host a Cameroon missionary speaker at FPC on the evening of September 3, 2006. After discussion, it was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed not to approve the request due to numerous event conflicts on that date affecting session members and the congregation. No alternative dates were available.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed to approve, pending a successful background check, the appointment of Cindy Runken as FPC's new MDO director.

The session approved changing the date of the August 2006 stated session meeting from August 20th to August 27th.

Rev. Hatcher closed the meeting with prayer at 8:20 p.m.

Called Meeting - August 20, 2006

The called meeting of the session was held at the church at 8:45 a.m. with the following elders, constituting a quorum, present: Becky Parmley, Brent Floyd, Taylor Buntin, Chris Brown, Bill Bailey, Ham Brankstone, and Jamie Tipton. The purpose of the called meeting was to receive a new member and baptismal requests.

Rev. Robert A. Hatcher, Jr. opened the meeting with prayer.

After examination, it was moved, seconded, and unanimously approved to receive Larry Moffitt as a new member by profession of faith. In addition, Larry requested his children, Kelsey Moffitt (10) and J. T. Moffitt (8), receive the rites of baptism. A motion to approve the baptisms was

made, seconded, and unanimously approved.

Rev. Hatcher closed the meeting with prayer at 8:50 a.m.

Called Meeting - August 20, 2006

The called meeting of the session was held at the church at 10:50 a.m. with the following elders, constituting a quorum, present: Becky Parmley, Jamie Tipton, Taylor Buntin, Chris Brown, Valeria Robertson, Bill Bailey, and Ralph Kennedy. A friend of the Hursey family, Charlotte Smith, was also present. The purpose of the called meeting was a baptismal request.

Rev. Robert A. Hatcher, Jr. opened the meeting with prayer.

David and Lucy Hursey presented their son, Thomas Hursey, and requested the rites of baptism. A motion to approve the baptism was made, seconded, and unanimously approved. Thomas will be baptized at the 11:00 a.m. worship service. The session also approved by common consent the Hursey family request that Elder Ray Manley stand with them during the baptism.

Treasurer Betty Floyd gave the treasurer's report. Contributions are up for the month; however, FPC is in the negative (\$3,200) year to date.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed to approve the following minutes as written: stated meeting of the July 16, 2006, meeting; called meeting of July 16, 2006; called meeting of July 27, 2006; and two called meetings of August 20, 2006.

Old Business: There was no actionable old business.

New Business: Property Committee recommendation to move forward with a church wide campaign to raise funds to purchase a new van was presented to the session by Chairman Brent Floyd. The recommendation was seconded and unanimously approved. The details of the fund raising effort will be determined by the property committee.

It was also moved, seconded, and unanimously approved for the Congregational Care Committee to sponsor a Fall Festival on October 21, 2006. The event will be a fundraiser for the Helping Hands ministry, which will provide support for FPC families with special medical needs. The event will include a cake sale, a silent auction, etc.

At 4:20 p.m., Rev. Hatcher closed the meeting with prayer.

The called meeting of the session was held at the church at 5:37 p.m. with the following elders, constituting a quorum, present: Frank Jue, Ray Hill, Ham Brankstone, Jamie Tipton, Taylor Buntin, Bill Bailey, Becky Parmley, and Ralph Kennedy. The purpose of the called meeting was to examine newly elected elders and deacons. Rev. Robert A. Hatcher, Jr. opened the meeting with prayer.

The newly elected elders (Michelle Eaves, Matt Parham, Bob Reiss, and Bill Stepp) and deacons (Robert Brankstone, Pam Hill, Julia Park, and Karen Sandridge), after having completed a period of study and preparation, were examined for ordination and installation. The session examined each newly elected elder and deacon as to their personal faith and their knowledge of the doctrine, government, discipline, worship and sacrament, the local church, and the duties of the office to which they were elected. Motions were made, seconded, and unanimously passed to sustain each newly elected church officer. The above elder-elects and deacon-elects will be ordained and installed at the 11:00am service on September 17, 2006.

At 6:29 p.m., Rev. Hatcher closed the meeting with prayer.

Stated Meeting - September 24, 2006

PYF leaders Ben and Tonia Marshall told the session that in early 2007 they would be leaving FPC and moving back to Georgia. Ben is going to take advantage of an early retirement offer from his employer. The session expressed gratitude for the work that Ben and Tonia have done at FPC

and wished them well in their relocation. A search will begin immediately for replacement PYF leadership.

In addition, a letter and overture, dated Sept. 10, 2006, was received from Ripley Presbyterian Church, Ripley, MS. The subject of both overtures was the 217th General Assembly's passage of an amended Peace, Unity, and Purity Task Force Report. No action was taken at this time.

The Office of Financial Aid for Studies is pleased to join you in supporting the future of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and honoring the dreams and aspirations of a First Presbyterian Church member planning for a career in ministry.

Davis Bailey was awarded the **Presbyterian Study Grant** to help meet the cost of education at Columbia Theological Seminary. The *Presbyterian Study Grant* is the General Assembly Council's only direct aid program for seminary students who plan to enter a church vocation.

Nationwide, approximately 136 students were awarded the *Presbyterian Study Grant*. The maximum award is \$4,000. The award is renewable for up to three additional years if the student continues to meet the academic and financial criteria for the award and is selected by the reading committee.

The Presbyterian Study Grant is entirely funded from endowment income and Extra Commitment Opportunity #860127. Gifts to ECO account #860127 will be used to provide grants to students in the Presbyterian Study Grant program. We hope that First Presbyterian Church will join us in prayer.
