From the Pastor's Heart

Dear Members and Friends,

As I met with our deacons and our elders on the session last Sunday I was mindful of the sacrifices that our members make for the sake of our church. Time is precious, but those who have answered God's call to serve Christ in the church give much time and attention to the church's needs.

Elders who chair committees give time and energy to help us plan and organize our ministries and programs. Deacons take time to contact new members and make sure that they feel welcome and included in our church. Teachers give time in the preparation of Bible lessons so that we can grow in our faith. Participants in our ministries organize their own time to be here for activities and events. Committee members contact those who visit our weekly worship to encourage prospective members. Others prepare food for church dinners or for households who face challenges or who need expressions of care. Still others call for the prayer ring or send cards to show our concern. Members organize and plan and work so that we can host special events, like the Fall Festival that is coming on October 21.

As I look at the calendar for October 2006 I see that our members will be doing something to build up our church's ministry on virtually every day of the month! We are a church whose members are busy sharing in ministry for our Lord and Savior Jesus. I want you all to know how grateful I am for the sacrifices of time and energy and care and love that go into your ministry for the Lord at FPC. Such things are the embodiment of Christian stewardship in our midst.

What makes you do it? What is the motivation for this kind of effort and sacrifice on the part of our members. Is it the reward? I know it's not the pay- in fact, for most of you there's considerable cost involved in your labors- but I hope there is a spiritual reward that comes from your sacrifice of time and resources. Is it the fun? I pray so- I hope our members enjoy working in concert and building relationships together in the Body of Christ. My family and I are greatly blessed to take part in the joy that this church generates in our life and the life of our community.

When I was a child in Sunday school we used to sing a song based on Galatians 2:20: "I am crucified with Christ: nevertheless I live; yet, not I, but Christ liveth in me: and the life that I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me, and gave himself for me" (KJV). That song came to mind a few days ago; I had not sung it in 30 or 35 years, but it came back to me word for word and note for note.

In short, that's where our motivation is found- simply in the joy of knowing that Christ died so that we might live, and that he rose so that our life might be abundantly full with the love of Almighty God for all eternity. It is our Lord's sacrifice for us that is the source of our hope. His love motivates us to love in return, living our lives for Him, giving of ourselves to build up His church.

Our stewardship program beginning this month bears the theme: "Time, Talents, Treasure." We will be reminded that our sacrifice of time and energy is only a reflection of the greatest sacrifice ever made on this earth- God's own Son who gave his life for the redemption of the world. The life that we share together is really His life in us. As we enter this year's stewardship emphasis, let us be mindful of our motivation. As the great hymn by Isaac Watts puts it, "Were the whole realm of nature mine, that were a present far too small. Love so amazing, so divine, demands my soul, my life, my all."

Session Minutes

Stated Meeting - July 16, 2006

The stated meeting of the session was held at the church at 5:07 p.m. with the following elders, constituting a quorum, present: Bill Bailey, Taylor Buntin, Chris Brown, Frank Jue, Jamie Tipton, Becky Parmley, and Ray Hill. Ralph Kennedy, Jason Parolli, Valeria Robertson, Ham Brankstone, and Brent Floyd were excused. DCE Joyce Dean was also present.

Rev. Robert A. Hatcher, Jr. opened the meeting with prayer.

Treasurer Betty Floyd was not present. However, a written treasurer's report was previously submitted and Rev. Hatcher reviewed the financial report with the session.

By common consent, minutes of the called meeting of May 28, 2006; called meeting of June 11, 2006; and the called meeting of July 2, 2006, were approved. Minutes of the stated meeting of May 21, 2006 were also approved after a correction was made.

Rev. Hatcher reported to the session on the July 11 called meeting of The Presbytery of St. Andrew.

Communications: On June 28, 2006, a letter was received from the First Presbyterian Church, Corinth, MS; and on June 30, 2006, a letter was received from the First Presbyterian Church, Greenwood, MS. The subject of both letters was the report of the Theological Task Force on the Peace, Unity, and Purity of the Church adopted by the 217th General Assembly. A called session meeting will be held on July 27, 2006 at 6:30 p.m., to discuss these communications.

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed to accept the resignation of Elder Becky Parmley as Director of the Mothers Day Out (MDO) program and to notify MDO board members that regular monthly meetings will start with the new school year. Beth Moore Study Begins

Just as the prophet Daniel faced unbelievable pressures to compromise his faith, to live in a hostile culture, and to confront temptations and threats—today's believers face many of the same trials.
