Session Minutes

Called Meeting - December 3, 2006

The stated meeting of the session was held at the church at 12:43 p.m. with the following elders, constituting a quorum, present: Becky Parmley, Bill Stepp, Ray Hill, Michelle Eaves, Taylor Buntin, Chris Brown, Ham Brankstone, Jason Parolli, Brent Floyd, and Ralph Kennedy. Elders Bob Reiss and Matt Parham were excused. Rev. Robert A. Hatcher, Jr. opened the meeting with prayer.

Treasurer's Report: Rev. Hatcher. Year-to-date, the church is in a negative financial position (approximately \$18,651.15). The session expressed concern over the deficit. If the church's financial position does not improve by the end of the year, the session will review the budget for possible reductions during the January 2007 session retreat.

Communications:

It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed to approve the minutes of the stated meeting of October 22, 2006 and the called meeting of November 5, 2006.

A letter, dated October 19, 2006, was received from Pleasant Hill United Methodist Church, Olive Branch, MS, requesting a Certificate of Transfer of membership for Tom and Susan Moody and their children, Emma and Rob (preparatory members). It was moved, seconded, and unanimously passed to approve the request.

A letter, dated November 6, 2006, was also received from The Presbytery of St. Andrew concerning overtures received from four sessions. The Presbytery will hold an open hearing on December 6, 2006 at 10:00AM to discuss the draft report of the Bills and Overtures committee.

Committee Reports:

Finance – Elder Chris Brown; Personnel – Elder Chris Brown

Christian Education – Elders Becky Parmley and Bill Stepp. Session voiced support for a proposed Inside/Out Fitness challenge from January 21, 2007 – April 14, 2007. The program will focus on church members becoming more physically and spiritually fit.

Mission – Jason Parolli; Evangelism – Elder Ray Hill

Stewardship – Elder Ham Brankstone.

Congregational Care – Elders Taylor Buntin and Michelle Eaves

Worship – Rev. Hatcher. The session voiced support for the continued use of liturgist during the 11:00 a.m. worship service.

Old Business: Rev. Hatcher reminded the session that the dates of the session retreat were January 12 -13, 2007. The retreat will be held at the church.

New Business:

After discussion, it was moved, seconded, and unanimously approved to move thirty three (33) members from inactive status to removal; twenty-four (24) members from active status to removal, fifteen members moved from active to inactive roll; and two (2) members moved from the inactive role to the active role.

It was also moved, seconded, and unanimously approved to give \$1,200 from the Helping Hands funds to Sharon Shackelford Marcum. Mrs. Marcum recently underwent a liver transplant and the funds are to help defray prescription medicine costs.

Called Meeting - December 17, 2006

The called meeting of the session was held at the church at 10:45 a.m. with the following elders, constituting a quorum, present: Taylor Buntin, Chris Brown, Michelle Eaves, Bob Reiss, Ray Hill, Bill Stepp, and Ralph Kennedy. The purpose of the called meeting was a baptismal request and to receive new members.

Rev. Robert A. Hatcher, Jr. opened the meeting with prayer.

Ben and Tonia Marshall presented their daughter, Kathryn, and requested the rites of baptism. A motion to approve the baptism was made, seconded, and unanimously approved. Kathryn will be baptized at the 11:00AM worship service.

In addition, after examination, it was moved, seconded, and unanimously approved to receive James L. (Jim) and Nancy Paulk as new members by transfer of letter from Salem Baptist Church, Raymond, MS.

Rev. Hatcher closed the meeting with prayer at 10:50 a.m.

This new year brings with it several unique and exciting musical opportunities. The first will take place right here in our own church on Sunday, February 25th at our 11:00AM worship service. The Miracles, a singing group from the Baddour Center in Senatobia, MS, will be bringing us a service in song. Many of you know Ryan Hays who sings in our choir from time to time. Ryan is the musical director of this famous choral group. This ensemble travels the U.S. on tour throughout the year and has a most demanding schedule. We are very fortunate to have the privilege to host this group at our church. Having heard this group some years ago I can tell you without reservation that they will warm your heart and lift your spirit in worship and praise. Please invite your family and friends to this special service.

The second event I would like to tell you about will occur in Sherman, TX. The American Boy choir of Princeton, NJ will be performing in a one night only concert on Thursday, May 10. If you have never heard this choir you should make every effort to do so. The best way I can describe them is that they sound how, I would imagine, the very angels of Heaven would sing. If you are interested in attending, please let me know as soon as possible and I will give you additional information. I am planning on attending myself, so perhaps we can form a group to travel and attend the concert together. Tickets are around \$10.

The other big choral event of the year is the Mormon Tabernacle Choir and Orchestra will be here in Memphis on July 2nd! Only the FedEx Forum is large enough to hold this massive choir and their legion of fans. As a large mostly volunteer choir, the Mormon Tabernacle is second to none. Their sheer size alone is impressive and the sound they produce is warm and exciting. The adult choir of our church will be attending as a group and we wanted to invite anyone else who is interested in hearing this magnificent choir to join us in our outing. We will be purchasing "middle range" price tickets of \$28, but with all the "extras" that the venue adds on the total will be \$37.05. There is one more item of interest on the horizon and this concerns our Youth Ensemble. Although this is just in the planning stages and there is much to be resolved before we see this happen, but it is possible that members of our youth choir will be participating in a mass choir of other youth choirs from around the country to sing and record a concert in the National Cathedral. 500 young singers join together for a weekend of rehearsals of some pretty daunting repertoire and then present a concert with a professional orchestra. It is a wonderful experience for all involved . . . from the singers to the adults who act as chaperones.

Those of us involved in the music ministry of the church thank all of you who have encouraged us with your kind words of support and praise. Many of you expressed how pleased and blessed you were by the Lessons and Carols service at Christmas, and for that we are very grateful. Please remember our music programs in your prayers as we continue to strive to sing the very best we can for God's glory. AARP Driver Safety Class

An AARP Driver Safety class has been scheduled at FPC on February 27 & 28. The class will meet from 8:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. each day.

AARP driver safety classes are eight hour driver education refresher courses for drivers 50 years old and over. The law in Miss. mandates that students 55 years of age and up who complete the class be entitled to receive an appropriate discount on their car insurance premium for the following three years.

You do not have to be an AARP member to enroll and won't be required to pass any tests. You must attend both 4-hour sessions to receive your completion certificate.

Seekers Sunday School Class

Linda Douty, the author of *How Can I Let Go if I Don't Know I'm Holding On?*, will provide an overview of her book in the Fellowship Hall at 9:45 a.m. on Sunday, Feb. 4. The Seekers adult Sunday School class will be studying this book in the coming weeks. Anyone who is interested or would like to see if they are interested, is encouraged to attend. Ms. Douty is a spiritual director who serves on the leadership team of the Academy of Spiritual Formation. A member of the United Methodist Church, she gives conferences and retreats and writes for a variety of religious publications, including *Upper Room*, *Alive Now*, and the website explorefaith.org.

In *How Can I Let Go?*, Douty takes a close-up look at the letting-go struggles all of us face. Weaving together her own experiences and the stories of others, she offers specific strategies for letting go of all the things that keep us from a deeper relationship with God and with others. With practical suggestions, including updated versions of classic spiritual practices, as well as questions for study and reflection, readers will find in this book a rich resource for personal spiritual growth as well as for group study.

CHOP News

Have you ever spent the night at a friend's house and tried to stay up all night? It sounds like fun at first but about 2am, you wonder how much longer you can stay awake and at 4 am, you have serious doubts about trying this again! On January 19th, 26 Jr High Youth and 3 adults spent the night in the fellowship hall. While some were able to catch a catnap here and there, several managed to stay awake all night. We played cards, hula hoops, dodge ball and ping pong - easy at 10 pm but by 3 am - that hand-eye coordination is a little off! We consumed 9 large pizzas, gallons of soda, and several bags of chips and cookies! We closed our lock in with a Sunrise Worship Service at 6 am in the sanctuary. After scripture reading and prayers, we turned off the lights for a quiet time to reflect on the night we shared and then watched the sun come up through the stained glass windows - the start of a brand new day. Then reality set in and we had to sweep and mop the fellowship hall, vacuum and put back all the furniture we moved! Saturday turned out to be a nice, cloudy day - perfect for sleeping!

In February, we will head to Camp Hopewell for the Jr. High Retreat. We are excited to have our own Davis and Julie Bailey as our keynote speakers for the weekend.

Our ongoing mission project is Operation Christmas Child. Each month, the youth are encouraged to bring in specific items for the shoe boxes. February's Gift of the Month is "something that gives you a warm, fuzzy feeling" - ex: a small stuffed animal. We are also collecting spare change to cover the cost of shipping the shoe boxes. We are collecting "Pennies for Peace," "Nickels for our Neighbors," "Dimes for Discipleship," "Quarters for Quality," and "Dollars for Delivering the Good News." Our goal is to fill each of these "banks" by November. This will cover the cost of the shoe boxes plus allow us to purchase a goat or other livestock through Samaritan's Purse.
